

Al-Qaeda's deputy leader in the Arabian Peninsula, a former prisoner in Guantanamo, is on Saudi Arabia's government's new Wanted list

The Jihadi online forums and the Arab media reported at the end of January 2009, that Saeed Ali Al-Shehri, aged 35, leader of the "Al-Qaeda in Saudi Arabia" organization (the "Qaidat Bilad Al-Haramain"), former prisoner no. 372 in Guantanamo, is now the deputy leader of "Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula" – an organization formed by a merger between Al-Qaeda in Yemen and Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula. Al-Shehri was responsible for the suicide bombing at the United States embassy in Sana'a in September 2008.¹

It should be noted that at the beginning of February 2009, Saudi Arabia published a list of 85 people wanted by the Saudi security forces. The inter-Arab newspaper "Al-Sharq Al-Awsat" and other Saudi newspapers published the wanted list, which includes the name of Saeed Ali Al-Sheri.²

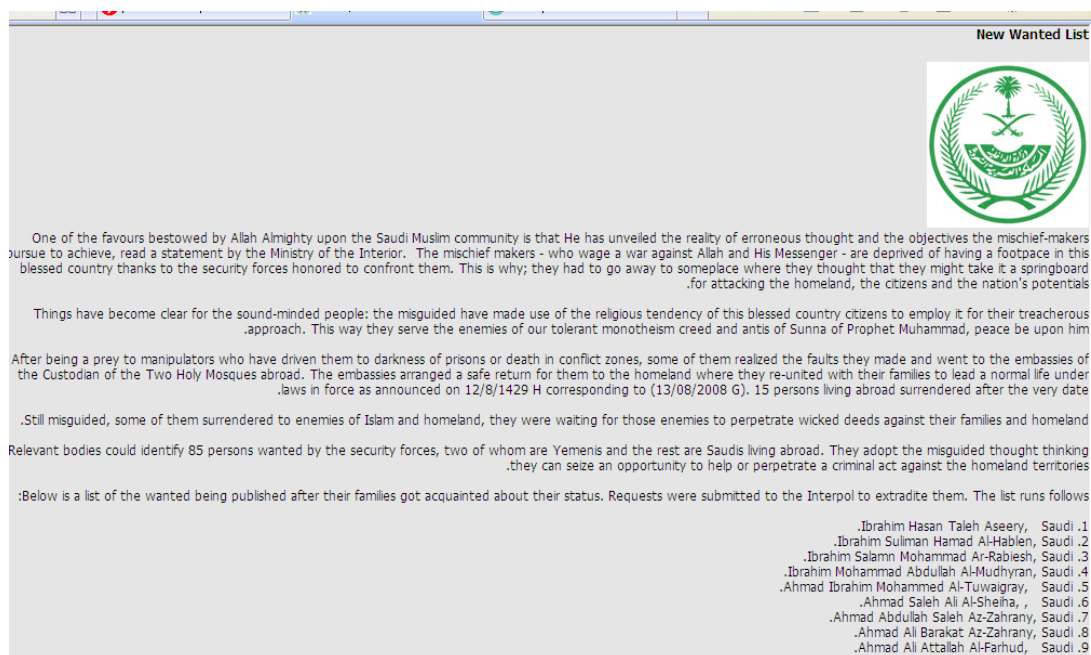

They will return safely to the homeland and get re-united with their families, and this will be borne in mind when looking into their cases.
