Assaf Moghadam is Senior Lecturer at the Lauder School of Government, Diplomacy and Strategy at the Interdisciplinary Center (IDC) Herzliya, Israel, and Senior Researcher at its International Institute for Counterterrorism (ICT). Previously, he was Assistant Professor at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, where he served as Senior Associate at the Combating Terrorism Center (CTC) and subsequently as Director of Terrorism Studies. Dr. Moghadam is the author of *The Globalization of Martyrdom: Al Qaeda, Salafi Jihad, and the Diffusion of Suicide Attacks* (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2008 [Paperback, 2011]) and *The Roots of Terrorism* (Chelsea House, 2006). He is the editor of the forthcoming book *Militancy in Shiism: Trends and Patterns* (Routledge, 2011), and co-editor (with Brian Fishman) of the forthcoming title *Fault Lines in Global Jihad: Organizational, Strategic, and Ideological Fissures*. Dr. Moghadam's research interests include terrorism, suicide terrorism, Al Qaeda and Global Jihad, and ethnic and civil conflict. His articles have been published in *International Security*, *Studies in Conflict and Terrorism*, *Terrorism and Political Violence*, and other outlets. Dr. Moghadam held predoctoral and postdoctoral fellowships at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs and at the Olin Institute for Strategic Studies, both at Harvard University. He holds a Ph.D. in international relations and a Master of Arts in Law and Diplomacy (MALD) from The Fletcher School at Tufts University, and a B.A. in political science from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.
