Amichai Magen is Head of Political Development and Senior Researcher at the International Institute for Counterterrorism (ICT). He is also an Adjunct Professor at the Lauder School of Government, Diplomacy and Strategy, and a Visiting Fellow at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University.

Previously, he was Director of the Institute for Democracy, Law, and Diplomacy at the Shalem Center, Jerusalem (2009-2011), and Lecturer in Law, Stanford Law School (2005-2009). Between 2004 and 2008 he was a Pre-Doctoral Fellow at the Center on Democracy, Development, and the Rule of Law (CDDRL), Freeman-Spogli Institute for International Studies, Stanford University. In 2008 he became the first Israeli to be awarded the prestigious National Fellow Award at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University. In 2002 he received the Yitzhak Rabin Fulbright Award. Amichai Magen holds a Doctorate in Juridical Science (JSD), LL.M. (First Class Honors, *magna cum laude*) and BA in Law and Political Science (First Class Honors, *summa cum laude*).

His interdisciplinary work has been published in leading academic journals including: the *Stanford Journal of International Law*, *Western European Politics*, and *International Studies Review*. He is also the editor of *International Actors, Democratization, and the Rule of Law* (Routledge 2009) (with Leonardo Morlino) and *Promoting Democracy and the Rule of Law: American and European Strategies* (with Thomas Risse and Michael McFaul). Dr. Magen's research addresses legal, economic and international relations aspects of political violence, security threats emanating from weak and failed states, conflict between states and armed non-state actors, processes of democratization in the Middle East, and governance in areas of problematic sovereignty.

Amichai Magen is also a member of the World Jewish Congress (WJC) Executive Committee.
